

HTML Lists

You may want to add a list to your website, detailing instructions for carrying out tasks, listing people in a department or something along those lines. There is HTML code which will lay out your list for you, and is particularly useful with ordered (numbered) lists where the numbers are automatically generated – meaning that you don't have to keep track, or re-number your entire list when you want to add something in the middle.

Firstly, you create your paragraph (or table cell), then you insert the code below.

Unordered (Bulleted) List

```
<p>
  <ul>
    <li>Burgers</li>
    <li>Hot Dogs</li>
    <li>Chips</li>
    <li>Nachos</li>
  </ul>
</p>
```

will create

- Burgers
- Hot Dogs
- Chips
- Nachos

Ordered (Numbered) List

```
<p>
  <ol>
    <li>Burgers</li>
    <li>Hot Dogs</li>
    <li>Chips</li>
    <li>Nachos</li>
  </ol>
</p>
```

will create

1. Burgers
2. Hot Dogs
3. Chips
4. Nachos

**** = Tells your browser that this is the start of an 'Unordered List'. **** to finish.

**** = Tells your browser that this is the start of an 'Ordered List'. **** to finish.

**** = Defines the start of a 'List Item'. **** to finish it
