

<code><p></code>	Starts a paragraph (aligned left by default)
<code><p align="left"></code>	Starts a paragraph with left alignment. This can be "left", "center", "right" or "justify"
<code></p></code>	Ends a paragraph (don't forget this!)
<code>
</code>	(line break, like using the 'Enter' key in Word)
<code>Bold text</code>	Bold text
<code><i>Italic </i> text</code>	<i>Italic</i> text
<code><u>Underlined </u> text</code>	<u>Underlined</u> text
<code></code>	States which font will be used (MUST be spelt exactly right)
<code></code>	States which color will be used (color list on next page)
<code></code>	States how large the text will be, with "1" being smallest and "7" being largest ('normal' is usually "2")
<code></code>	<u>Must</u> be put at the end of the section of text affected
<code></code>	Adds an image with the filename "banana.jpg" to your page. The align="left" (and so on) attribute can be added to this tag. The filename can be whatever you want it to be, but must be spelt exactly as it is on the file, and is case-sensitive.
<code>click here</code>	Turns the words "click here" into a link which takes the user to another webpage called "page2.htm". The words "click here" can be replaced with any other words of your choice, or even an image!

Notes: Attributes shown in red can be 'stacked' in one 'tag' by entering a space, followed by the next attribute. You can use as many or as few attributes as you like in one 'tag'

For example: `` would work fine. Do NOT forget to 'close' the tag with `</p>` or `` after the affected section – even at the very end of the page - as you would lose marks and it could cause undesirable side-effects on your webpage.
